Current Position at CWA

James Blythe joined the Food & Agricultural Commodities Department as a Food Scientist in 2012.

He is involved in the investigation of damage causation, quantum and mitigation of claims made on durable foods, feeds and fresh produce cargoes. He has incident attendance experience in Africa, Europe, the Middle East, Asia, North, Central and South America.

James has a solid background in biological sciences; including biochemistry, microbiology, and ecology all of which he regularly uses in claims involving various dry agricultural commodities, feedstuffs and fresh produce.

Specific Expertise and Experience

James has experience of a wide range of bulk and bagged cargoes covering cereals, oilseeds and feed cargoes. This includes the associated problems with their carriage such as water damage/wetting, caking, self-heating, insect infestation, moulds, mycotoxins, and other associated quality issues.

James has specific knowledge of the requirements of internationally recognised sampling regimes such as GAFTA Sampling Rules No. 124, FOSFA sampling and ISO 24333. He has been involved in the arrangement and supervision of sampling exercises and the subsequent laboratory analysis of samples.

He has also investigated insect infestations of bulk, bagged and containerised cargoes. Cases have involved on-site attendance to identify possibly sources of common grain insect and cockroach infestations, negotiate with port/ quarantine authorities and advise on suitable infestation treatments including insect trapping, insecticide spraying and fumigation (including aluminium phosphide (phosphine), methyl bromide and sulphuryl fluoride).

He has also been involved in investigating historical commodity prices to determine whether claim values are accurately calculated and involved in mitigating loss of damaged cargoes by liaising with potential salvage buyers.

Specific cases have involved:

<i>Softs:</i>	Raw sugar, bagged refined white sugar
<i>Fresh Produce:</i>	Bananas
<i>Frozen:</i>	Mackerel
